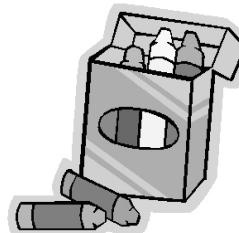


STORYCRAFT

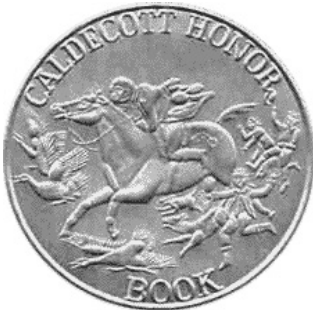

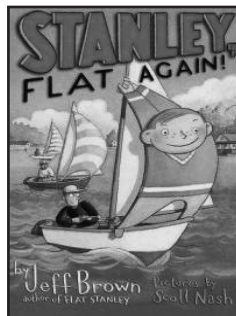

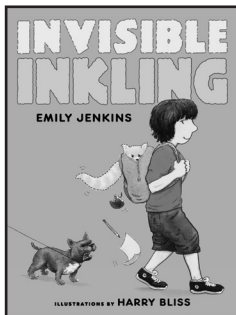

ONLINE RESOURCES



Have you tried the Library's Mango? It's not an exotic fruit ... it's an easy-to-use online language-learning system. Mango contains dozens of world languages for speakers of English and over one dozen English courses for speakers of other languages. Each lesson combines real life situations and audio from native speakers with simple, clear instructions. If your computer has a microphone and speakers, you can listen to the phrases and record yourself repeating them. The courses are built around an appreciation for the culture of other countries.

To use Mango, go to the Library's website www.nassaulibrary.org/shelter and click on the Mango icon on our home page. You can create an account if you wish to track your progress or you can click immediately on Start Learning. Choose between Basic, everyday phrases in a short period of time, and Complete, an in-depth study of the language and its culture.

Mango wants to make learning a language fun, whether for business, travel or personal interest. They even have a short course in speaking Pirate!
